It would help us greatly if all members could list down the names of the family members and the children's ages, and also approximate directions (road name etc) to your property so a comprehensive list can be kept of where properties are situated. It will be a help if there is a fire and we know where your property is.

The restrictions on lighting fires are lifted at the end of March, so burning off can now be attended to.

HANDY HINTS

For a grease resistant finish when washing linen, dissolve one
dessertspoon of gelatine in hot water and add to the rinse
water.

To stop colours from running, before washing the article
dissolve a packet of Epsom salts in cold water and rinse them
in this then wash in the usual way.

Adding a little ammonia to soaking water for whites will
loosen dirt and restore whiteness. Add a little to the wash
water for whiter clothes, to soften and remove grease.
Ammonia does not have the harsh effects of bleach.

SULTANA AND BRAN LOAF

2 cups Bran	2 cups sultanas
1 1/2 cups sugar	2 1/2 cups milk

Soak the above ingredients for 1 hour. Add 2 cups of self-
raising flour and mix well. Cook in moderate oven for 3/4 to 1
hour.
