### TREE PLANTING IN THE DROUGHT. PLANT OR NOT TO PLANT?

Last winter and spring produced the worst seasonal conditions for tree planting in the past ten years, but it is quite surprising what good results can be achieved by correct ground preparation and planting, even in adverse conditions.

Approximately 4 ha of Pinus radiata was planted on Inverary on a dry rocky ridge in early July. The only rainfall that fell on these open rooted seedlings was 22mms in the following 3 1/2 months. Not only was the rainfall low, but frost severity and wind factors were extreme, greatly increasing evaporation rate and tree stress.

To avoid disappointment I did not visit the site until late December when I took a random sample count. The results showed a failure rate of 29 in 1000 (less than 4%). This result was better than I had experienced in good sites in good years. The only explanation was due to proper and careful preparation. The area was ripped with a single winged tyne in January, sprayed with Velpar at 12lt/ha in April and planted in fairly dry ground in July. No water was used.

These results may not transfer to all species. I have recently planted 800 mixed Eucalypts in December in extremely dry conditions and will report on these later. These were watered in once, 2 days after planting.

My advice is "don't curtail your planned plantings because of weather" with proper ground preparation, good results can still be achieved. Also consider the fact that you have already outlaid money in fencing and preparation, possibly on tree orders, not to mention time spent. Cut your losses and plant anyway, they won't grow on the back lawn if you leave them there and you can't keep them till next season. Inspections are welcome at any time at Inverary. Just contact me and arrange a convenient time.

## GARDENING IN FEBRUARY

This is the month that bulbs start appearing in nurseries. Bulbs can be planted in mass, in groups, rockeries or pots. Plan now for your bulb garden planting.

Fruit trees should be watched for fruit fly especially around apples, pears and quince trees.

Control these with Rogor or Lebaycid spray when necessary.

Rose pruning can be done to reduce the height of the new wood and this will ensure a crop of new well developed roses in the autumn. They should also have some complete rose fertiliser.

In your vege garden: With autumn approaching, now is the time to start planning for a continuous supply of vegetables during winter. It is very important to start planting cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli and brussel sprouts. This enables them to get established before the cold weather. They need a soil containing plenty of compost and well rotted animal manure, plus a side dressing of lime before planting.

Carrots, parsnips celery, kohlrabi, lettuce, parsley, radish and turnips may be planted as well.

Mildew on marrow, cucumbers, squash and zucchini can be controlled by spraying with Zineb or Benlate.

### APPLE TEA CAKE

from Goulburn Baptist Church Cookery Book

2 oz butter  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 egg  
1 cup self raising flour  
little milk

Topping:  
1 apple  
1 tsp sugar  
1 tsp cinnamon

Cream butter and sugar, add egg and beat well, fold in flour. Add enough milk to make a nice even mixture. Place mixture in greased 7" or 8" sandwich tin and grate apple evenly on top. Mix cinnamon and sugar and sprinkle on top of apple. Cook in a moderate oven for approx. 1/2 hour. When cold, serve cut into slices and butter.
