GARDENING IN NOVEMBER



Spray roses with "Triforine" to prevent Black Spot. Where space allows between shrubs and perennials, plant zinnias, petunias, phlox, dahlias and other favourite summer annuals. Ensure that their colour compliments the adjoining plants. Cut back Michaelmas daisies to 12 inches so they grow back and flower better than last year and they won't need supporting.

Divide and plant chrysanthemums and dahlias. Nip chrysanthemums to 8 inches if not already done. Lift bulbs if necessary. Plant the last of the gladioli and asters. Divide and replant water lilies if necessary.

Mulch with compost where space allows to feed the shrubs.

In the vege garden: cut asparagus for eating, plant tomato plants, squash seed, pumpkins, sweet corn, beans, peas, lettuce, parsnips, radish, carrots, beetroot, and silver beet.

Fertilise strawberries, then pack around with pine needles to protect the fruit.

COOK'S CORNER

Mud Cake (Should keep fresh for a week)

250gm butter	150gm Dark chocolate (Chopped)
2 cups sugar	1 cup hot water
1/3 cup whisky	1 tablespoon instant coffee
1½ cups plain flour	¼ cup cocoa
2 eggs lightly beaten	

Grease a 23cm square slab tin and line base with greased paper. Mix butter, chocolate, sugar, water, whisky and coffee in a heat proof bowl. Stir over hot water until chocolate has melted and mixture is smooth. Transfer to a large bowl and stir in sifted flours and cocoa, then eggs. Pour into prepared pan. Bake in moderate to slow oven for 75 mins. Let stand for 10 mins before turning onto wire rack to cool. Serve in squares with whipped cream.

A FEW SIMPLE STEPS TO PREVENT FALLS

Falls have enormous social, health and economic costs for both older people and the whole community. About a third of older people fall each year and half of all falls occur in and around the home.

A few simple steps can make your home safer. This checklist is a guide to those steps. A safer home can help you maintain an independent lifestyle.

This checklist is a series of questions which looks at safety in and around your home.

If you answer 'no' to any of the questions, the checklist suggests action you can take to make your home safer. Most changes are easy and inexpensive. Many of the items you may need such as paint, hand rails, slip-resistant strips and lighting are available from hardware or department stores. Sales assistants or local service organisations will usually be able to help arrange someone to install the items where necessary.

It's up to you to take steps to prevent a fall.

SUGGESTIONS

- You are less likely to slip on surfaces such as carpet or unglazed tiles. These surfaces are preferable to polished floors which can be very slippery.
- There are also paint on non-slip products.
- Remove all loose mats or ensure they are firmly secured and have non-slip underlay
- Make sure your carpets are in good condition.
- Always wipe up spills as soon as they occur. Some floor surfaces are particularly slippery when wet.

Bush Fire issues

The bush fire season began officially on 1 October. Permits for lighting fires are required and can be issued by the Permit Officers for the Bungonia Brigade - A Davey and C Klein.

All brigades would welcome more volunteers. If you can spare some time and join the volunteers, please contact the brigade captain.

New Training Facility

A new bush fire training facility for the Shire was opened in Goulburn last month. It was funded by the Lord Mayor's Appeal which was set up after the January 1994 fires and helped along by many very generous donations from individuals and local businesses.

This will provide much needed facilities for all brigades

to enable crews to be properly and adequately trained for any emergencies.

Home industry

J Mottley's application to carry on a stone profiling and shaping activity at his Lookdown Road property was approved. Conditions include a requirement that no waste is allowed to accumulate on site and hours of operation be restricted to weekdays 8am to 5pm and Saturdays 8am to noon.

Gully rehabilitation

A proposal by A & M Davey to rehabilitate an eroded gully at Maxwell Park, Bungonia with compacted tyres has been agreed to, subject to appropriate certification of the design and a 120-day time limit for completion of the project.

Poultry breeding facility

An application from Ingham Enterprises Pty Ltd to establish a Quarantine poultry breeding facility at Billabong on the Marulan-Bungonia Road was on display at Marulan Post Office and Council offices in Montague Street, Goulburn, during October.

Written submissions or objections were invited and any received will be taken into consideration when the matter comes before Council for a decision.
