## GARDENING IN JUNE

*(From "New Idea")*

*(We regret that this was received too late for inclusion in the May issue.)*

Every gardener should know about the 'birds and bees' because these tireless workers are in harmony with Mother Nature. Bees cross-pollinate the flowers, which become the fruit on the trees and shrubs and in the vegetable patch. Birds, besides being lovely to look at, can be thanked for gobbling many of the tiny creatures that might become pests in the garden.

To attract birds and bees to the garden, provide their favorite plants, such as Callistemons (bottle brush). Most Grevilleas attract birds, as do the long brushes or banksias. Also consider the correa's attractive small shrubs. Varieties that grow in the area are *c. pulchella*, *c. manni*, and *c. reflexa*. The flower colour can vary. Other plants to attract birds are *melaleuca hypericifolia*, *hakea laurina*, *anigozanthos flavidus* (Kangaroo Paw) and *Kunzea Baxteri*.

INDIGENOUS PLANTS are those that grow well in a particular area.

Plant or transplant any evergreen or deciduous shrub or tree, including roses.

Divide up perennials such as Ajuga, Snow-in-Summer, Michaelmas Daisy, and Agapanthus and plant where gaps occur in your beds, so that you can create a total ground cover to choke out weeds.

Prune all summer flowering shrubs such as Hydrangeas, Lavender, Abelia, Hebe, Rock Rose, May, Hypericum, Welgela, Kolkwitzia. Lift dahlias at the end of June and place under a hedge or in light shade.

Mulch with compost all garden beds to protect the roots of your plants from biting frost. Dig over the vegetable patch with added decomposed manure. Use fallen leaves and manure to prepare compost heaps.

## COOKERY CORNER

### QUICK, WARMING, EASY, YUMMY MICROWAVE CASSEROLE

Large can peeled tomatoes and juice      2 cans sliced mushrooms in juice  
cup of cooked rice      fat-free mince  
frozen chopped onions      salt to taste

Microwave slowly on medium heat until cooked to your satisfaction.

If you cook it very slowly, you can use a couple of tablespoons of uncooked rice.

### CHICKEN CASSEROLE:

1 steamed chicken (already cooked), meat removed from bones.

4 oz finely chopped bacon

can of cream of mushroom soup (or can of mushrooms)

paprika

1/2 cup milk

1/2 cup cream

Stir all the above ingredients together

Top with fresh breadcrumbs and small pieces of butter.

Bake in moderate oven until light brown.

## LANDCARE

### INVERARY CREEK LANDCARE GROUP FIELD DAY

The success of the Landcare movement was shown by the combined Field Day with Pomeroy Landcare Group on April 21. Representatives from both, plus Windellama and Canyonleigh YOTS were taken on a tour of what has been achieved within the Inverary Landcare boundaries since formation in 1992. The 42 people who attended were shown the extensive earthworks and tree plantings in progress to arrest soil degradation problems and dryland salinity.

This, according to Inverary President K.Cooper, is the next step in Landcare. Every group has its own expertise and now this must be shared across the groups. Both the Wollondilly CMC and the Upper Shoalhaven CMC are supporting the Landcare Movement and encouraging the formation of new groups. We hope to have two new groups in operation in Bungonia before long.

The group was lucky enough to have in attendance Rex Wagner, who worked with CALM in this area several years ago. His informative talk on saline areas and the problems of their management, was appreciated. We must learn to live with dryland salinity and to manage the saline areas as a productive part of the farm. They can be treated and made productive again with correct care and development.

The day was spent discussing earthworks and associated tree plantings. Farm Forestry will obviously become very significant in the area in the future. The planting of both natives and P.radiata give an alternative to traditional farming.

The Youman Tree Planter and Direct Seeder were demonstrated, showing how large areas can be planted at minimal cost. Two operators with the tree planter can easily plant in excess of 5000 trees per day. The Inverary Group hopes to add a mounder to its equipment next year. Anyone interested in these machines can contact the Inverary President for details.

The next field day will be on Sunday, August 4. Meet at Inverary at 10am. All welcome.

We will concentrate on all aspects of P.radiata silviculture - ground preparation, hand planting and machine planting, spraying for weed control and marketing of P.radiata.
