GARDENING IN MARCH

Plant alyssum, pansies, violas, stocks, poppies, calendulas, carnations, polyanthus, dianthus, larkspurs, snapdragons, statice and verbena seedlings now. This is the month for aphids and other bugs to appear on roses so now is the time to spray with Malathion or Rogor 40 and Lebaycid. Have you tried spraying with one teaspoon of Vegemite in one litre of water? In the vegetable garden, this is your last chance to plant cauliflowers, cabbages, brussel sprouts, and broccoli. Use a liquid fertiliser on the seedlings. You can also plant lettuce, parsnips and white onions. This is a good time to fertilise your lawns ready for winter.

Council Considerations - Affecting Bungonia

Building Application Fees

The Department of Local Government has amended regulations to increase the minimum fee for a building application from \$5 to \$50, plus an amount calculated on the value of the building.

This means, for example, that a house extension valued at \$2500 would attract a building application fee of \$62.50.

The new regulation came into effect on 1 January 1996.

Heritage Issues

The Department of Urban Affairs and Planning has invited Council to apply for a grant under the 1996 Heritage Assistance Program which would require dollar for dollar contributions from Council if approved.

Although there are not any large sums of money available in the current budget, I am interested to hear about heritage issues in our area that may be worthy of funding, study or promotion.

Quarantine Facility

The proposed quarantine facility on the Marulan-Bungonia Road requires an exclusion zone of 2km in radius which prohibits any commercial

poultry facilities from operating within that zone. An amendment to the Mulwaree Local Environmental Plan is being prepared to bring this into effect.

This will not affect poultry kept purely for domestic use.

Road and Locality Names

In line with other rural areas across the State, Mulwaree is undertaking a rural addressing project which will define the boundaries of localities such as Bungonia, allocate names to roads which at present are known only by their geographic direction (eg the Goulburn-Bungonia Road) and give 'street numbers' to properties determined by their distance from the start of the road.

All residents are invited and encouraged to participate in this process, particularly in suggesting road names and locality boundaries.

There will be an extensive consultation process with exhibitions and public meetings on this issue.

Timber Logging

Approval was granted to for a timber logging operation near Windellama.

The approval conditions include a contribution to road maintenance.

The operation will mean three semi-trailer loads of timber per week being hauled along the Goulburn-Windellama Road to timber mills in Camden.

Windellama Creek

Work is expected to commence shortly on the concrete causeway at Windellama Creek on the Windellama-Bungonia Road.

Because the causeway is low and the catchment area at the site quite extensive, the cost of reinforcement work to cover a one in two storm event would cost around \$200,000.

The work to be undertaken this year will cover a one in five year storm event and will cost \$50,000.

It should be possible to upgrade the causeway in later years if this is needed.

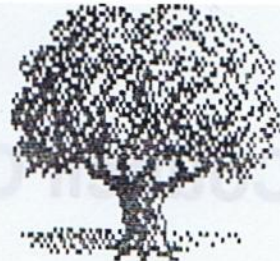

INVERARY CREEK LANDCARE FIELD DAY REPORT

'FARMING FOR THE FUTURE'

The field day held at Inverary on Sunday, 4th February, proved the most successful yet, with 36 participants being treated to the most recent innovations in gully erosion control. The fact that 36 people are still interested in the field days proves the success of this Landcare Group in passing on information to the public and in spreading the Landcare message.

Various aspects of the seriousness of the erosion problems, and what rectification could be attempted, were covered by several guest speakers. President K.COOPER wishes to thank them for their participation. Thanks to ALICE GARDINER, Landcare Facilitator, GAVIN PRYDE and ALISON BOWCOCK, Economist, all from the Dept. of L.A.W.C., MARIA COLEMAN from the University of Wollongong, NEIL COOPER from A.C.T. Forests, and PAT and INDA EVANS.

The Landcare Group now intends to extend their activities into detailed sub catchment planning, which will include all waterways in our area. We hope to have more project work approved for the Cowhole Creek as well as Inverary and Limekiln Creeks in the next funding period.

Anyone who missed the field day can contact the President at any time for an inspection of this or any other project. On April 14th we will be hosts to the Pomeroy Landcare Group to show what we have achieved. Then later we can return the visit. The exchange of ideas between groups is most essential in the spread of the Landcare message. At this stage we could have two more groups in the area - Marulan Road (Stony and Jerrara Creeks) and Upper Bungonia Creek.

Funding applications have now been completed for 1996/7 including 4 field days per year so we look forward to support in the future at these days. Each will be advertised in the "Bungonia Times" and in mail to all members.

COOKERY CORNER

FRUIT CRUMBLE TOPPING

1 cup rolled oats 1 cup flour 1 cup sugar and enough butter to make a moist crumble.

Place all dry ingredients in bowl. Mix well. Add 1oz butter and cut finely. Use fingers to mix in, to make crumble. Keep adding butter until mix is nice and moist. Place on top of fruit, dry or stewed. Cook for 35 - 40 minutes at 200 C.
