GARDENING IN SEPTEMBER

Ensure that all your roses have been well pruned and sprayed to prevent Black Spot. Spray peaches and nectarine with lime sulphur. Divide and plant out chrysanthemums and water lilies. Plant out gladioli at fortnightly intervals to get a longer blooming period. Complete dividing and planting out perennials such as Michaelmas daisy, phlox, achillea and scabiosa. Plant spring and summer annuals such as sweet peas, snapdragons, stocks and asters. Be careful not to damage lily shoots emerging now and remove dead leaves from iris. Cut back buddleia, hydrangea and ceanothus. Complete mulching with compost wherever space allows. Sow new lawns now. In your vegetable garden plant asparagus, peas, lettuce, carrots, strawberries and globe artichokes.

CAPTAIN'S REPORT FOR 1996/1997.

A total of 8 fires were attended during the last 12 months and 128 man hours were spent on these incidents. Fast and efficient responses to these incidents, meant that they were contained quickly. One of the main concerns seems to be city based hobby farmers who claim to be unaware of the current fire restrictions and when they apply. Possibly, signs coming into the area from the Marulan side, would assist with this.

After many years of hard work by numerous people, the new Fire Shed has finally been completed. Bungonia/3 and Bungonia/4 have been permanently stationed there since the end of March. Working bees are ongoing, with the radio mast etc. still to be completed.

Training activities have been held on a regular basis and have included a Basic Training Course, Shire Competition Day, Pump Training, map reading, and incident control systems, and much 4WD work, the most popular training appears to be in the form of Fire Trail Inspection days.

On the equipment side, a full stocktake of Shire Pumps and tanks was held in September, and members are reminded that they have an obligation to maintain Brigade and Shire equipment in good condition and ready for immediate use. A quick fill pump is now stationed on Bungonia/3. Apart from a few minor problems, Bungonia/3, Bungonia/4 and Bungonia/4-2 are all in good running order. Unfortunately Bungonia/4-1 is completely out of service until it is bought up to R.T.A. standards.

Of significance this year, the new Rural Fire Service Act came into force recently. However, after much discussion, the regulations are still being modified because of significant opposition to them from members.

Many thanks for all the help and support I have received throughout the year, from all of you and especially Andy Smith and Dennis Jenkins.

Welcome to Spring

I know there are still plenty of frosts about, but isn't it great to see the first spring blossoms coming out and new growth in the paddocks?

The colours of spring and autumn are one of the reasons I chose to live in this area. It is tops in country living!

May this year's farm production be plentiful for everyone!

Development Application

A development application has been received and advertised for a service station and auto repair facility on the Bungonia-Windellama Road at the Jacqua Road intersection.

Noxious Weeds

A nasty called Chilean Needle Grass is likely to be declared a noxious weed in the Shire soon. With the amount of Serrated Tussock and African Lovegrass around, we certainly don't need another weed to take hold.

Serrated Tussock is still the most prevalent and most noxious weed we have and is probably also the most expensive to get rid of.

So it's better to declare war on the weed before it takes over the whole place.

Each tussock produces literally thousands of seeds which can blow on the wind for many kilometres, infesting large tracts of your, and your neighbours', land on the way.

If you have a large or heavy infestation, it may be worth joining with neighbours to consider aerial spraying or at least a joint campaign to help stop the spread.

Landcare

The Landcare program may be a good way of developing projects over large areas to eradicate weeds and control regrowth where there are big infestations.

If anyone is interested in more detail, please let me know.

Airport

Goulburn City Council's Airport Committee is pushing strongly for Sydney's second airport to be located at Gundry Plains in Mulwaree Shire. They claim there will be no air, noise or water pollution "so long as the flight paths are not over Goulburn City".

It's very kind of them to want to foist this pollution over our heads with flight paths over Bungonia and Marulan. Obviously we don't count.

If you have views about this issue, don't be the silent majority - become the vocal majority and tell them through the media that you don't want their airport.

Grants

The Department of Sport and Recreation has not yet determined

a closing date for 1997/98 applications for financial assistance. As soon as more information is available I will pass this on to you.

Arts Group

Arts, craft and culture have been growing in the Shire but so far, there have been no co-ordinated activities in our area for those interested in these issues.

As Council's representative on the Southern Tablelands Regional Arts Advisory Council which co-ordinates arts projects throughout the region and administers regional funding proposals, I have been working towards establishing a local group.

A group of this nature would be in a position to apply for funding for new projects, organise and participate in local arts and cultural events.

An initial meeting of interested artists and craftspeople from Bungonia, Tallong, Towrang and Marulan districts was held last month and I will let you know the outcomes as soon as this information is available.
