GARDENING IN MARCH

This is most likely to be your last chance to plant your cauliflowers, cabbage, brussel sprouts or broccoli. Don't forget to use some liquid fertilisers to get these plants started. Other plants to be planted now are lettuce, turnips, radish and white onions.

Flowers: seedlings that can be planted are alyssum, pansy, viola, stocks, poppy, calendula, carnations, dianthus, polyanthus, larkspur, wallflower, sweet William snapdragon, statice, verbena and for an attractive border in the spring, Virginian stock directly into the garden. This dainty spring annual has small flowers in white, cream, soft pink and lavender and when the buds start to appear in early spring, give them a feel of liquid fertiliser. They also look attractive in tubs and pots.

This month also, insects such as aphids and various caterpillars can appear on roses. Spray them with Malathion or Rogor 40 and Lebaycide. Black aphids on chrysanthemums can be controlled by spraying them with malathion. Make sure you don't use Rogor or Lebaycide as these systemic chemicals can burn the new plants.

March is also a good time to fertilise your lawns with a complete lawn fertiliser to brighten them up as well as strengthen the lawn through winter. This helps to keep it looking good through winter too.

If you like propagating, this is the month to take cuttings of geraniums, fuschia and hydrangeas., Put the cuttings in a terra cotta pot 10cm across, this will take approximately 10 to 12 cuttings and making sure they are planted around the edge as they get more warmth. Using a mixture of 1 part coarse sand and 2 parts peatmoss, have at least 2 eyes in the mixture and 2-3 eyes out, making sure the mixture does not dry out.

LIBRARY NEWS

Library Links - 31 January 2000 Great Reasons to Come to the Goulburn Branch Library

If you are a student studying for your Higher School Certificate, the Goulburn Branch Library can help you find the information you need to complete that assignment.

There are different information resources available for in-library use as well as resources that can be taken home including:

- HSC File – contains a range of resources including Infocus, Hot Topics, Issues for the Nineties/Issues in Society.

Infocus is an initiative of the State Library to provide students with current information on all HSC subjects. The information comes in the form of articles taken from books, magazines and newspapers.

Issues for the Nineties/Issues in Society are educational resource books about contemporary Australian Social Issues. The information comes from government reports and statistics, newspaper reports, magazine articles and surveys, Internet web site material, literature from lobby groups and charitable organisations. Issues covered include bullying, unemployment in Australia and suicide.

Hot Topics are booklets of current legal issues in plain language produced by the Legal Information Access Centre. Issues in Hot Topics include Firearms, Native Title and Relationships.

All material from the HSC File can be borrowed for a one-week loan period.

- Subject Collection – Books on an extensive range of subjects including Ancient and Modern History, English, English Literature and Biology are available for loan. Study Guides on a number of HSC Subjects are also available for loan, including Excel HSC Legal Studies, Excel HSC Drama, Excel HSC Modern History and Excel HSC Society and Culture.

If you need assistance writing essays/reports check out the following: Essay writing made easy, Writing as essay: How to improve your performance for coursework and examination and Writing made easy : an extensive guide to writing for English students.

To find specific titles take a look on the library computer catalogue or ask a staff member for assistance

All books in the subject collections can be borrowed for a three week loan period.

- Reference Collection – Is a collection of dictionaries, atlas's, encyclopaedia's, fact books, daily newspapers and information books that are available for in-library use.
- The Legal Tool Kit is a series of legal books and pamphlets in plain English that is part of the Reference Collection. The books cover a range of legal issues from being arrested to understanding the law.
- The Internet – Is available for use for free for up to 20 minutes on five of the public access computers. From the Southern Tablelands Regional Library Home Page, (<http://www.goulburn.nsw.gov.au/library/>) you can access Search Engines and information links to other Internet resources. Printouts can be obtained for 20cents per page.
A feature of the library homepage is "Have A Question?" If you have a reference query and are unable to come to the library you can send your question via email. The library can help you with any questions that can be answered using the library collection and/or the resources available on the Internet.
- Previous HSC exam papers (1997 – 1998) are located on five of the public access computers. The CD-ROM published by the Board of Studies covers all HSC subjects. Printouts can be obtained at 20cents per page.

To find out more about resources and services come into the Goulburn Branch Library and have a look.

If you are need of help to locate information always ask a library staff member for assistance.
