### Re-petition regarding the electricity outages.

## GARDENING IN MAY

This is the time of year when a lot of general cleaning up can be carried out in your garden.

With cooler nights, mildew which is a fungus, can be seen on the leaves of Dahlias, Hydrangea, Petunias, Delphiniums, Easter Daisies, Pumpkins and Cucumbers as well as some others but it is not worth spraying with a fungicide. Delphiniums and Easter Daisies can be cut back about 8cm, above ground and with Dahlias, cut the stems above the leaf node. If you cut between the nodes, the stems being hollow can fill with water and the bulbs can rot.

Any leaves covered with mildew should not be put in compost heaps as this fungus will spread through your garden when the compost is spread next season. Make sure you burn those leaves or put them in the bin as garbage.

This month many perennial plants such as Polyanthus, Russell Lupin and Delphiniums can be divided making sure when you replant them to dig some compost into the garden as well as a light dressing of complete fertiliser.

Vegetables to sow are very limited as any seedlings planted now lay dormant during the winter months. Broad Beans are excellent to plant now, they do very well in the cooler climate, but before sowing the seed only, give the bed a good dressing of garden lime.

Onion plants are available now as well in nurseries. Plant white and odourless onions only though. Onions need very little water, plenty of sun, good drainage and before sowing a light dressing of complete fertiliser.

Flower seedlings that can be planted now include Calendula, Stock, Wallflower, Alyssum, Poppy, Pansy, Viola and Verbena.

Another general clean up job is to lift Gladioli bulbs and store them in a box or hang them up in an airy shed.

# SERVICES AT YOUR LIBRARY

The Goulburn Branch Library offers the residents of Goulburn City and Mulwaree Shire a wide variety of services and facilities including:

\*Internet access and Word Processing facilities. Internet terminals can be booked for sessions of 30 minutes. Word processing is available for a booking fee of \$2.20 (inc GST) per hour. Bookings are essential for Internet and word processing sessions and can be made by telephone or in person at the library loans desk. Internet and word processing printouts can be obtained for 20 cents per page. Check out the Southern Tablelands Regional Library's home page [www.goulburn.nsw.gov.au/library/](http://www.goulburn.nsw.gov.au/library/).

- \*Photocopying. Copies can be made at a cost of 20 cents for black and white copies, \$2.50 for A4 colour copies and \$5.00 for A3 copies.
- \*Facsimile services. Faxes can be sent or received by the library at a cost of \$4.40 (inc GST) for the first page and \$1.10 (inc GST) for the following pages within Australia.
- \*Regional History Room. Contains a range of resources covering local history and family history. The library is a deposit for the State Records Authority of New South Wales allowing for access to convict records, shipping and arrival records and State archives relating to Aboriginal people.
- \*LIAC. The Legal Information Access Centre contains a collection of law books in plain English to assist people in finding out more about the law.
- \*ABS. The library is part of the Australian Bureau of Statistics Library Extension Program (LEP). This makes a range of their publications available for reference at many public and tertiary libraries throughout Australia. Core list collections which contain the most important ABS national and state publications are sent to public libraries including the Goulburn Library.
- \*Storytime. Held every Tuesday and Thursday at 11:00am during the school terms for children under school age, accompanied by an adult.


There is no charge for placing reservations and borrowing but it is essential that you bring your library card. To join the library, please bring some identification that shows your current residential address such as a driver's licence or rates notice with you.

The library is open Monday, Wednesday, Friday 10:00am – 6:00pm, Tuesday and Thursday 10:00am – 7:00pm, Saturday 10:00am – 5:00pm and Sunday 2:00pm – 5:00pm.


